The 2010 AP Summer Institute: Latin

In light of the recent changes in the structuring of the AP Latin exam, this summer's session will focus not only on Vergil, but also the SATII exam, possible alternative courses, and integrating other authors, especially Caesar, into the course.

For the 17th summer the University of Dallas will offer one of the few AP summer institutes in Latin in the country. The collegiality of the institute and the time to concentrate on the AP syllabus have proven invaluable to the many participants over the years. The participants will leave with some materials ready to use in the AP course and ideas for teaching the AP class.

The 2010 AP Summer Institute at the University of Dallas will concentrate on the Vergil but will also explore Caesar. It will look at texts, ancillary materials, enrichment possibilities and teaching techniques. Special attention will be given to the new materials which have recently been published as aids for teaching. Grading the 2010 exam will enable teachers to define their own criteria. Inexperienced teachers will gain familiarity with the texts and the course. Experienced AP teachers will glean new ideas and techniques to use. Participants should bring their own text (s), a dictionary, translations, and any questions they might have.

The lead teacher for AP Latin is Ms. Donna Gerard of Providence Christian School of Texas. A veteran Latin teacher, she has assisted hundreds of Latin teachers in developing and enriching advanced placement programs. University of Dallas Faculty will lecture as appropriate.

Times: Classes meet 8:30am to 4:30pm, with an hour for lunch, Tuesday through Friday. Saturday classes meet from 8:30am to 12:00 noon at which time the Institute will conclude. Certificates of attendance will be provided. College credit is not available.

Tuition: Tuition is \$450 including lunch and printed materials. Texas Public School teachers may apply for a state-funded reimbursement of \$450. The University has set aside one tuition scholarship per private school.

Housing: Dorm accommodations include Monday supper, three meals per day, Tuesday- Friday, and breakfast on Saturday. Phone jacks are in each room. Rooms are located on floors with community baths (each room has its own sink). All facilities are air-conditioned. Dorm residents may check in on Monday afternoon, July 5. A possible excursion to one of the local museums is included. Room and Board is \$300.

Registration: Application and payment for the AP Summer Institute must be received by July 1, 2010. No refunds will be made after this date. Make checks payable to "UD APSI." Mail, fax, or call your interest/reservation.
